A Closer Walk: Experience the Global Epidemic of HIV and AIDS

The Department of Public Health Education will co-sponsor a showing of "A Closer Walk" with Project SAFE, a campus peer-education group whose goal is to broaden awareness of the risk of sexually transmitted diseases. *A Closer Walk* is a powerful video on the global epidemic of AIDS that encourages people to get involved in some capacity to reduce the pain and suffering of AIDS. This video utilizes stories, portraits, and vignettes of children, women, and men living with AIDS in four countries. In addition, the department has conducted a fund-raiser to sell beads produced by an HIV/AIDS support group in Ghana, West Africa, to increase awareness of the global impact of HIV/AIDS and to assist in the provision of medications and food to those who are suffering with this disease. These beads will be on display before and after the video.
