- Served as an Intern with NC Governor Jim Hunt (Summer 1981);
- Served as NCCU's Student Government Association President (1981-1982);
- Served as the President of NC Association of Historical Black Colleges and Universities Student Government Associations (1981-1982); and
- Had lunch with U.S. President, Ronald Reagan at the White House (1982) as a result of organizing NC's Black College Day March.

I currently reside in NE Washington, DC and work for the U.S. Department of Labor in Washington, DC; where I have been employed for over 17 years.
